


WORDS OF OUR PRINCIPAL & DEAN



ICAR History

The Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) is an autonomous organization under the Department of Agricultural Research and Education (DARE), Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Government of India. Formerly known as Imperial Council of Agricultural Research, it was **established on 16 July 1929** as a registered society under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 in pursuance of the report of the Royal Commission on Agriculture. The ICAR has its headquarters at New Delhi. The Council is the apex body for coordinating, guiding and managing research and education in agriculture including horticulture, fisheries and animal sciences in the entire country. With 101 ICAR institutes and **71 agricultural universities** spread across the country this is one of the largest national agricultural systems in the world. The ICAR has played a pioneering role in ushering Green Revolution and subsequent developments in agriculture in India through its research and technology development that has enabled the country to increase the production of **food grains by 5.4 times, horticultural crops by 10.1 times, fish by 15.2 times, milk 9.7 times and eggs 48.1 times since 1951 to 2017**, thus making a visible impact on the national food and nutritional security. It has played a major role in promoting excellence in higher education in agriculture. It is engaged in cutting edge areas of science and technology development and its scientists are internationally acknowledged in their fields.

BACA, AAU History

Bansilal Amrutlal College of Agriculture established in 1947 with the tireless efforts by Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel-the Ironman of India, learned Shree Kanaiyalal Maneklal Munshi and Agricultural scientist Dr. M. D. Patel since its inception, has been significantly contributing to agricultural development and research as well in the state of Gujarat and nation at large. A huge workforce of trained teachers and scientists has been working for the tremendous activities in education, research and extension education. Every year approximately, 140 students at undergraduate and 120 at postgraduate level enroll in agricultural studies from different parts of India and abroad. After constitution of Anand Agricultural University (2004) around 2700 graduates and post graduates and since establishment of the institute (1947) around 10,000 graduates and post graduates students have earned their degree from this institute and most of them have been working in the various fields of agriculture with reputed agencies of India and abroad. Since years, higher efficiency and expertise in the subject and leadership guts-these three have become the core identity of the students of the institute. Use of latest technology in education, research and extension has always been encouraged here. Due to this, students from the institute really have sound knowledge along with the latest updates in the field of agriculture. There are 18 departments working on crop-breeding, crop-production, crop-protection and Social Sciences and thereby carrying out various activities of education, research and extension education.



The Mandate...

- To contribute to the advancement of knowledge in agricultural science and technology and to solve the environmental problems to make human living more comfortable.
- To meet the need of agricultural manpower for social, professional and economic development through teaching, research, practical training and extension education.

To promote learning in an environment conducive to free -thinking and innovation to cultivate the skills, attitudes and habits of life-long learning, so as to be well prepared to adapt to a rapidly evolving society

To cater the need for knowledge workers in our rural society and focus on lifetime employability rather than lifetime employment.

RESEARCH:

Taking the queries and problems of farmer community into account, different departments of the institute carry out varieties of experiments and there by prepare recommendations which are useful to

the farmers and scientists. To make the students and farmers aware, an educational museum has been developed where different types of seed and compost, samples of agricultural tools, pest control and weed control are displayed. Apart from this a well-planned crop-cafeteria is also available where more than 150 types of crops are being planted according to the seasons. Long-term experiments of weed and weed control are also being carried out and by these experiments the impact of residue of weed-control chemicals and its residual impact on the next crop are also being studied. Under the conservation agriculture, effects on crop-production, soil-fertility and microbiologists are being observed with and without weed-control chemicals.

Weather based agricultural advisory service is being provided to the farmers of Middle Gujarat on every Tuesday and Friday with the help of different media like email, message, website, display system, newspapers, television, radio etc. Under the projects affiliated to ISRO, 43 automated weather forecast centers are established by ISRO at Agricultural Research Centers in Gujarat and every two hour, the statistics of different weather parameters are made available on the website. Some useful microbial products like organic fertilizers, bioagents and biological dialyzers are also developed. Around 52 recommendations regarding the use of organic fertilizer are made by various departments of the college. Department of Microbiology has been awarded many prestigious awards at state and national level. With public partnership commercialization, four MoU are signed with the companies producing agricultural products using the technology developed for liquid organic fertilizer. With a view to commercialize the technology developed for organic fertilizer, four agreements are signed with the companies producing agricultural products and with public partnership; it has been made available in the market for a wide use by the farmer community. Under 'Rashtriya Krushi Vikaas Yojna', with the help of Govt. of India and Govt. of Gujarat, technology for fungus caused soil-diseases like root rot, blight, damping off have been developed. Latest software like SPSS, , SAS, Python, RARCH, GARCH, MINITAB etc. are being used for analysis in various post graduate and departmental research works.

EXTENSION:

Lectures, training programs and demonstrations regarding modern techniques of agriculture are organized by all the departments of the college throughout the year. Demonstrations and trainings are also organized for promoting organic farming. Through such training programs farmers get trained for weed control and weed management, organic farming and use of pest controls. Awareness of side effects of pest controls on the soil-fertility and quality crop production are also created among the farmers. Agriculture related queries and problems of the farmers are also discussed and solved in such programs. Farmer community get the guidance of scientists during Krushi Mahotsav and materials on various agricultural issues and developments are also distributed among farmers. Horticulture department has provided 33 recommendations for fruit crops, 22 for vegetable crops, 9 for flowers and one for trees which would be very helpful to the farmers and scientists as well. Horticultural crops have always been an incredible element of nation's economy. Gardener's training center every year organizes training for many garden-



ers in Middle Gujarat and through this youth can get better employment. Lectures and training programs are organized to train the farmers on how to use modern techniques like Green House, Net House, Drip Irrigation etc. for enhanced production with more benefit.

Training programs with latest technology used in agriculture are organized by the scientists in Agril-Economic Dept. under the activities of 'World Trade Organization'. Such training programs help the farmers to avail more benefits through farming by quality production of the crops by using the latest techniques in farming. Seed Science and Technology department organizes training related to seed production, seed processing and selling for the seed-producers and merchants. In modern agriculture testing of soil and water plays a crucial role. Department of Soil Science and Agricultural Chemistry organizes training programs for water and soil tests and spreads the awareness amongst farming community and it also enables youth for better employability.

Report Summary of Swaminathan Committee on Farmers

(October 2006)

Background

The National Commission on Farmers (NCF) was constituted on November 18, 2004 under the chairmanship of Professor M.S. Swaminathan. The Terms of Reference reflected the priorities listed in the Common Minimum Programme. The NCF submitted four reports in December 2004, August 2005, December 2005 and April 2006 respectively. The fifth and final report was submitted on October 4, 2006. The reports contain suggestions to achieve the goal of “faster and more inclusive growth” as envisaged in the Approach to 11th Five Year Plan.

Terms of Reference

The NCF is mandated to make suggestions on issues such as:

- (a) a medium-term strategy for food and nutrition security in the country in order to move towards the goal of universal food security over time;
- (b) enhancing productivity, profitability, and sustainability of the major farming systems of the country;
- (c) policy reforms to substantially increase flow of rural credit to all farmers;
- (d) special programmes for dryland farming for farmers in the arid and semi-arid regions, as well as for farmers in hilly and coastal areas;
- (e) enhancing the quality and cost competitiveness of farm commodities so as to make them globally competitive;
- (f) protecting farmers from imports when international prices fall sharply;
- (g) empowering elected local bodies to effectively conserve and improve the ecological foundations for sustainable agriculture;

Key Findings and Recommendations

Causes for farmers' distress

Agrarian distress has led farmers to commit suicide in recent years. The major causes of the agrarian crisis are: unfinished agenda in land reform, quantity and quality of water, technology fatigue, access,

adequacy and timeliness of institutional credit, and opportunities for assured and remunerative marketing. Adverse meteorological factors add to these problems.

Farmers need to have assured access and control over basic resources, which include land, water, bioresources, credit and insurance, technology and knowledge management, and markets. The NCF recommends that “Agriculture” be inserted in the Concurrent List of the Constitution.

Land reforms are necessary to address the basic issue of access to land for both crops and livestock. Land holdings inequality is reflected in land ownership. In 1991-92, the share of the bottom half of the rural households in the total land ownership was only 3% and the top 10% was as high as 54%.

Some of the main recommendations include:

- Distribute ceiling-surplus and waste lands;
- Prevent diversion of prime agricultural land and forest to corporate sector for non-agricultural purposes.
- Ensure grazing rights and seasonal access to forests to tribals and pastoralists, and access to common property resources.
- Establish a National Land Use Advisory Service, which would have the capacity to link land use decisions with ecological meteorological and marketing factors on a location and season specific basis.
- Set up a mechanism to regulate the sale of agricultural land, based on quantum of land, nature of proposed use and category of buyer.

Irrigation

Out of the gross sown area of 192 million ha, rainfed agriculture contributes to 60 per cent of the gross cropped area and 45 per cent of the total agricultural output. The report recommends:

- A comprehensive set of reforms to enable farmers to have sustained and equitable access to water.
- Increase water supply through rainwater harvesting and recharge of the aquifer should become mandatory. “Million Wells Recharge” programme, specifically targeted at private wells should be launched.
- Substantial increase in investment in irrigation sector under the 11th Five Year Plan apportioned between large surface water systems; minor irrigation and new schemes for groundwater recharge.

Productivity of Agriculture

Apart from the size of holding, the productivity levels primarily determine the income of the farmers. However, the per unit area productivity of Indian agriculture is much lower than other major crop producing countries.

In order to achieve higher growth in productivity in agriculture, the NCF recommends:

- Substantial increase in public investment in agriculture related infrastructure particularly in irrigation, drainage, land development, water conservation, research development and road connectivity etc.
- A national network of advanced soil testing laboratories with facilities for detection of micronutrient deficiencies.
- Promotion of conservation farming, which will help farm families to conserve and improve soil health, water quantity and quality and biodiversity.

Credit and Insurance

Timely and adequate supply of credit is a basic requirement of small farm families.

The NCF suggests:

- Expand the outreach of the formal credit system to reach the really poor and needy.
- Reduce rate of interest for crop loans to 4 per cent simple, with government support.
- Moratorium on debt recovery, including loans from non-institutional sources, and waiver of interest on loans in distress hotspots and during calamities, till capability is restored.
- Establish an Agriculture Risk Fund to provide relief to farmers in the aftermath of successive natural calamities.
- Issue Kisan Credit Cards to women farmers, with joint *pattas* as collateral.
- Develop an integrated credit-cum-crop-livestock-human health insurance package.
- Expand crop insurance cover to cover the entire country and all crops, with reduced premiums and create a Rural Insurance Development Fund to take up development work for spreading rural insurance.
- Promote sustainable livelihoods for the poor by improving (i) Financial services (ii) Infrastructure (iii) Investments in human development, agriculture and business development services (including productivity enhancement, local value addition, and alternate market linkages) and (iv) Institutional development services (forming and strengthening producers' organisations such as self-help groups and water user associations).

Food Security

The Mid-term appraisal of the 10th Plan revealed that India is lagging behind in achieving the Millennium Development Goals of halving hunger by 2015. Therefore, the decline in per capita foodgrain availability and its unequal distribution have serious implications for food security in both rural and urban areas.

The proportion of households below the poverty line was 28% in 2004-05 (close to 300 million persons). However, in 1999-2000, the percentage of population consuming diets providing less than 2400 kcal (underlines definition of below poverty line) per capita per day was almost 77% of the rural population. Several studies have shown that the poverty is concentrated and food deprivation is acute in predominantly rural areas with limited resources such as rain-fed agricultural areas.

The report recommends:

- Implement a universal public distribution system. The NCF pointed out that the total subsidy required for this would be one per cent of the Gross Domestic Product.
- Reorganise the delivery of nutrition support programmes on a life-cycle basis with the participation of Panchayats and local bodies.
- Eliminate micronutrient deficiency induced hidden hunger through an integrated food cum fortification

approach.

- Promote the establishment of Community Food and Water Banks operated by Women Self-help Groups (SHG), based on the principle ‘Store Grain and Water everywhere’.
- Help small and marginal farmers to improve the productivity, quality and profitability of farm enterprises and organize a Rural Non-Farm Livelihood Initiative.
- Formulate a National Food Guarantee Act continuing the useful features of the Food for Work and Employment Guarantee programmes. By increasing demand for foodgrains as a result of increased consumption by the poor, the economic conditions essential for further agricultural progress can be created.

Prevention of Farmers’ Suicides

In the last few years, a large number of farmers have committed suicide. Cases of suicides have been reported from states such as Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Kerala, Punjab, Rajasthan, Orissa and Madhya Pradesh. The NCF has underlined the need to address the farmer suicide problem on a priority basis.

Some of measures suggested include:

- Provide affordable health insurance and revitalise primary healthcare centres. The National Rural Health Mission should be extended to suicide hotspot locations on priority basis.
- Set up State level Farmers’ Commission with representation of farmers for ensuring dynamic government response to farmers’ problems.
- Restructure microfinance policies to serve as Livelihood Finance, i.e. credit coupled with support services in the areas of technology, management and markets.
- Cover all crops by crop insurance with the village and not block as the unit for assessment.
- Provide for a Social Security net with provision for old age support and health insurance.
- Promote aquifer recharge and rain water conservation. Decentralise water use planning and every village should aim at Jal Swaraj with Gram Sabhas serving as Pani Panchayats.
- Ensure availability of quality seed and other inputs at affordable costs and at the right time and place.
- Recommend low risk and low cost technologies which can help to provide maximum income to farmers because they cannot cope with the shock of crop failure, particularly those associated with high cost technologies like Bt cotton.
- Need for focused Market Intervention Schemes (MIS) in the case of life-saving crops such as cumin in arid areas. Have a Price Stabilisation Fund in place to protect the farmers from price fluctuations.

- Need swift action on import duties to protect farmers from international price.
- Set up Village Knowledge Centres (VKCs) or Gyan Chaupals in the farmers' distress hotspots. These can provide dynamic and demand driven information on all aspects of agricultural and non-farm livelihoods and also serve as guidance centres.
- Public awareness campaigns to make people identify early signs of suicidal behavior.

Competitiveness of Farmers

It is imperative to raise the agricultural competitiveness of farmers with small land holdings. Productivity improvement to increase the marketable surplus must be linked to assured and remunerative marketing opportunities.

The measures suggested by NCF include:

- Promotion of commodity-based farmers' organisations such as Small Cotton Farmers' Estates to combine decentralised production with centralised services such as post-harvest management, value addition and marketing, for leveraging institutional support and facilitating direct farmer-consumer linkage.
- Improvement in implementation of Minimum Support Price (MSP). Arrangements for MSP need to be put in place for crops other than paddy and wheat. Also, millets and other nutritious cereals should be permanently included in the PDS.
- MSP should be at least 50% more than the weighted average cost of production.
- Availability of data about spot and future prices of commodities through the Multi Commodity Exchange (MCD) and the NCDEX and the APMC electronic networks covering 93 commodities through 6000 terminals and 430 towns and cities.
- State Agriculture Produce Marketing Committee Acts [APMC Acts] relating to marketing, storage and processing of agriculture produce need to shift to one that promotes grading, branding, packaging and development of domestic and international markets for local produce, and move towards a Single Indian Market.

Employment

Structural change in the workforce is taking place in India albeit slowly. In 1961, the percentage of the workforce in agriculture was 75.9% while the number decreased to 59.9% in 1999-2000. But agriculture still provides the bulk of employment in the rural areas.

The overall employment strategy in India must seek to achieve two things. First, create productive employment opportunities and second to improve the 'quality' of employment in several sectors such

that real wages rise through improved productivity. The measures to do so include:

- Accelerating the rate of growth of the economy;
- Emphasizing on relatively more labour intensive sectors and inducing a faster growth of these sectors; and
- Improving the functioning of the labour markets through such modification as may be necessary without eroding the core labour standards.
- Encourage non-farm employment opportunities by developing particular sectors and sub-sectors where demand for the product or services is growing namely: (i) trade, (ii) restaurants and hotels, (iii) transport, (iv) construction, (v) repairs and (vi) certain services.
- The “net take home income” of farmers should be comparable to those of civil servants.

Bioresources

Rural people in India depend on a wide range of bioresources for their nutrition and livelihood security. The report recommends:

- Preserving traditional rights of access to biodiversity, which include access to non-timber forest products including medicinal plants, gums and resins, oil yielding plants and beneficial micro-organisms;
- Conserving, enhancing and improving crops and farm animals as well as fish stocks through breeding;
- Encouraging community-based breed conservation (i.e. conservation through use);
- Allowing export of indigenous breeds and import of suitable breeds to increase productivity of nondescript animals.

Nobel Laureates of Agriculture

Norman Borlaug



A central figure in the “green revolution”, **Norman Ernest Borlaug** (born March 25, 1914) was born on a farm near Cresco, Iowa, to Henry and Clara Borlaug. For the past twenty-seven years he has collaborated with Mexican scientists on problems of wheat improvement; for the last ten or so of those years he has also collaborated with scientists from other parts of the world, especially from India and Pakistan, in adapting the new wheats to new lands and in gaining acceptance for their production. An eclectic, pragmatic, goal-oriented

scientist, he accepts and discards methods or results in a constant search for more fruitful and effective ones, while at the same time avoiding the pursuit of what he calls “academic butterflies”. A vigorous man who can perform prodigies of manual labor in the fields, he brings to his work the body and competitive spirit of the trained athlete, which indeed he was in his high school and college days.

After completing his primary and secondary education in Cresco, Borlaug enrolled in the University of Minnesota where he studied forestry. Immediately before and immediately after receiving his Bachelor of Science degree in 1937, he worked for the U.S. Forestry Service at stations in Massachusetts and Idaho. Returning to the University of Minnesota to study plant pathology, he received the master’s degree in 1939 and the doctorate in 1942.

From 1942 to 1944, he was a microbiologist on the staff of the du Pont de Nemours Foundation where he was in charge of research on industrial and agricultural bactericides, fungicides, and preservatives.

In 1944 he accepted an appointment as geneticist and plant pathologist assigned the task of organizing and directing the Cooperative Wheat Research and Production Program in Mexico. This program, a joint undertaking by the Mexican government and the Rockefeller Foundation, involved scientific research in genetics, plant breeding, plant pathology, entomology, agronomy, soil science, and cereal technology. Within twenty years he was spectacularly successful in finding a high-yielding short-strawed, disease-resistant wheat.

To his scientific goal he soon added that of the practical humanitarian: arranging to put the new cereal strains into extensive production in order to feed the hungry people of the world – and thus providing, as he says, “a temporary success in man’s war against hunger and deprivation,” a breathing space in which to deal with the “Population Monster” and the subsequent environmental and social ills that too often lead to conflict between men and between nations. Statistics on the vast acreage planted with the new wheat and on the revolutionary yields harvested in Mexico, India, and Pakistan are given in the

presentation speech by Mrs. Lionaes and in the Nobel lecture by Dr. Borlaug. Well advanced, also, is the use of the new wheat in six Latin American countries, six in the Near and Middle East, several in Africa.

When the Rockefeller and Ford Foundations in cooperation with the Mexican government established the International Maize and Wheat Improvement Center (CIMMYT), an autonomous international research training institute having an international board of trustees and staff, Dr. Borlaug was made director of its International Wheat Improvement Program. In this capacity he has been able to realize more fully a third objective, that of training young scientists in research and production methods. From his earliest days in Mexico he has, to be sure, carried on an intern program, but with the establishment of the Center, he has been able to reach out internationally. In the last seven years some 1940 young scientists from sixteen or so countries (the figures constantly move upward) have studied and worked at the Center.

Dr. Borlaug is presently participating in extensive experimentation with triticale, a man-made species of grain derived from a cross between wheat and rye that shows promise of being superior to either wheat or rye in productivity and nutritional quality.

In addition to the Nobel Peace Prize, Dr. Borlaug has received extensive recognition from universities and organizations in six countries: Canada, India, Mexico, Norway, Pakistan, the United States. In 1968 he received an especially satisfying tribute when the people of Ciudad Obregon, Sonora, Mexico, in whose area he did some of his first experimenting, named a street in his honor.

Har Gobind Khorana



Har Gobind Khorana was born of Hindu parents in Raipur, a little village in Punjab, which is now part of eastern Pakistan. The correct date of his birth is not known; that shown in documents is January 9th, 1922. He is the youngest of a family of one daughter and four sons. His father was a «patwari», a village agricultural taxation clerk in the British Indian system of government. Although poor, his father was dedicated to educating his children and they were practically the only literate family in the village inhabited by about 100 people.

Har Gobind Khorana attended D.A.V. High School in Multan (now West Punjab); Ratan Lal, one of his teachers, influenced him greatly during that period. Later, he studied at the Punjab University in Lahore where he obtained an M. Sc. degree. Mahan Singh, a great teacher and accurate experimentalist, was his supervisor.

Khorana lived in India until 1945, when the award of a Government of India Fellowship made it possible for him to go to England and he studied for a Ph. D. degree at the University of Liverpool. Roger J. S. Beer supervised his research, and, in addition, looked after him diligently. It was the introduction of Khorana to Western civilization and culture.

Khorana spent a postdoctoral year (1948-1949) at the Eidgenössische Technische Hochschule in Zurich with Professor Vladimir Prelog. The association with Professor Prelog molded immeasurably his thought and philosophy towards science, work, and effort.

After a brief period in India in the fall of 1949, Khorana returned to England where he obtained a fellowship to work with Dr. (now Professor) G. W. Kenner and Professor (now Lord) A. R. Todd. He stayed in Cambridge from 1950 till 1952. Again, this stay proved to be of decisive value to Khorana. Interest in both proteins and nucleic acids took root at that time.


A job offer in 1952 from Dr. Gordon M. Shrum of British Columbia (now Chancellor of Simon Fraser University, British Columbia) took him to Vancouver. The British Columbia Research Council offered at that time very little by way of facilities, but there was «all the freedom in the world», to use Dr. Shrum's words, to do what the researcher liked to do. During the following years, with Dr. Shrum's inspiration and encouragement and frequent help and scientific counsel from Dr. Jack Campbell (now Head of the Department of Microbiology at the University of British Columbia), a group began to work in the field of biologically interesting phosphate esters and nucleic acids. Among the many devoted and loyal colleagues of this period, there should, in particular, be mention of Dr. Gordon M. Tener (now a Professor in the Biochemistry Department of the University of British Columbia), who contributed much to the spiritual and intellectual well-being of the group.

In 1960 Khorana moved to the Institute for Enzyme Research at the University of Wisconsin. He became a naturalized citizen of the United States. As of the fall of 1970 Khorana has been Alfred P. Sloan Professor of Biology and Chemistry at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Har Gobind Khorana was married in 1952 to Esther Elizabeth Sibler, who is of Swiss origin. Esther brought a consistent sense of purpose into his life at a time when, after six years' absence from the country of his birth, Khorana felt out of place everywhere and at home nowhere. They have three children: Julia Elizabeth (born May 4th, 1953), Emily Anne (born October 18th, 1954), and Dave Roy (born July 26th, 1958).

Kary Mullis



My father Cecil Banks Mullis and mother, formerly Bernice Alberta Barker grew up in rural North Carolina in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains. My dad's family had a general store, which I never saw. My grandparents on his side had already died before I started noticing things. My mother's parents were close to me all during my childhood, and her father Albert stopped by to see me in a non-substantial form on his way out of this world in 1986. I was living in California. "Pop" died at 92 and wondering what was happening to me out in California, stopped by Kensington for a couple days. My house afforded a view

of San Francisco and the Golden Gate Bridge. His visit was an odd experience. Not at all frightening. I have cultivated the curious things in life and found this one pleasant. "Pop" and I sat in the evenings in my kitchen and I told him about the contemporary California world while we drank beer. I drank his for him as it appeared that although he was very much there for me, he was not there at all for the beer. Many of my friends when I told them of this thought it fanciful. (I think it more likely than much of our math today and at least half of our physics, both of which I like).

Until I was five my immediate family lived near my grandfather's farm where my mother had grown up, and with the exception of a few modern conveniences, had not changed a lot over the years.

My grandfather milked several cows twice a day and supplied the neighbours with dairy products. He liked to go visiting around the county on Saturdays and he also enjoyed the neighbours when they came by once a week with their empty milk jars. He walked them out to their cars and hung over the driver's side window until they drove off. The road was two tire tracks on well mown grass between barbed wire fences, cows off to the right, alfalfa or sometimes corn to the left.

I remember mostly the summers. My mother and aunts presided out on the big screened back porch shelling peas, stringing beans, peeling apples, pears, and peaches. The peaches were peeled with a special machine that had a hand crank and left a spiraling groove on what was left of the peach. The peels went to the pigs. Everything else went into steaming Mason jars which would go down into the earthen floored cellar. Down there in the dark, and it was always a little moist, were spiders in abundance and magnificent biodiversity. My brothers, and my cousins, and I ventured into the cellar once in a while to inspect the sweet potatoes and the hibernating jars. No one wanted to stay there alone ever, and mostly we played in the woods, the swamp, the orchards, the barn, the granary, which had wasps, and the woodshed, which also had wasps and, like the barn, allegedly, snakes.

We tortured the cows. We sliced apples and slipped them onto the electric fence that contained them in the newer parts of the pasture. Cows like apples and they kept trying. We watched the chickens pecking at the black mud around their chicken house. We heard the squeal of young pigs being castrated by my grandfather and the veterinarian, but we weren't allowed to watch. We heard stories from our moms about balls of fire during thunder storms streaming up the drain pipe that led down to the chicken yard and dancing out of the sink onto the grey floor of the back porch. All the scorched marks had been sanded and painted over by the time we heard about it, and sadly it never happened while we were there. But there were thunderstorms. Rain would come down from a cloudburst in the summer afternoons and the woods would explode with thunder. Our moms would keep us inside and out of the draft from any windows. We... wanted to see those fireballs.

We could play in the attic. Even in the day there was not enough light to keep us calm in the attic, and there were animal-skin coats and unfamiliar garments that lurked in the closets. There was a horrible picture of Teddy Roosevelt killing a bear. Very bloody. And there were black widow spiders waiting



for us always, down in their funnel shaped webs in all the dark corners. It was a thrilling place during a thunderstorm and, like the hay loft of the barn, a place where my pre-adolescent sexuality concerning my cousin Judy, who was one month my senior, would come a little more sharply into focus. We were only nine or ten, but it was there already with it's pressing curiosity. We sometimes kissed. My techniques have improved, but not the thrill.

When my great-grandmother died she was almost a hundred and we were glad to see her go because every time she would come over to my grandmother's house, she would try to kiss all of us. She looked almost a hundred and, heartless, cruel, mindless little children that we were, she repulsed us. She grabbed us anyway and kissed us until she was through. They put her body in a metal casket with gauzy curtains and left it in the living room near the grandfather's clock, which announced the hours with a number of resonant bongs and marked the half-hours with a single chilling tone. Her body was there for three days until the service on Sunday at Mt Zion Baptist Church. We dared each other to go in and look at her. The adults were unaffected and took their regular meals right in the next room. We found it difficult to sleep. The clock seemed more alive than usual.

My great-grandmother, as I learned from Judy much later, when we were adults, had been an unusual woman in Saw Mills, North Carolina. She lived just a bit on the wild side. She gave birth to my grandmother out of wedlock following an affair with a railroad man named Stowe. We never heard much about him. "Nanny", as we called our great-grandmother, was tolerated by the community because she was the only person for miles around who knew the rudiments of medicine. She provided medical care to livestock, for which she had been trained, but also to people for whom she was the only alternative on her side of the Catawba River. She also ran the post office in Granite Falls. She was the first postmistress anyone had heard about, and rural North Carolinians at the time were not in the mood for new customs, but they accepted what they couldn't avoid. And granite does fall.

When my grandfather, "Pop", James Albert Barker, son of Cary Barker from Cary, N.C. decided to marry Nanny's illegitimate daughter, Princess Escoe Miller, his father gave him a piece of land to farm and tolerated his choice of bride. My given name derives from Cary with a slight change of spelling that my mother thought practical so as to keep my initialed name from being the same as my Dad's, C.B. Mullis. She probably never imagined that I would be living far away before it ever mattered.

The rest of my life has passed quite suddenly. Around ten or twelve I fell into the inevitable logarithms of time. It seems to go faster and faster. I wonder now why we have to have Christmas so often.

I went to high school in Columbia. I met my first wife, Richards, whom I married while I was working on a B.S. in chemistry at Georgia Tech. She bore Louise and I studied. I learned most of the useful technical things, math, physics, chemistry, that I now use, during those four years. I did little else, except to play with Louise and change her diapers at night. We moved to Berkeley, California in 1966. I did my Ph.D. in biochemistry under J.B. Neilands and there I learned the rest, the non-technical things. After that, it



happened so quickly that it's hard to really talk about in the wake of my grandparents' farm.

Except for Cynthia and our boys.

I met Cynthia while I was in Kansas for three years. She's the very special daughter of an old grain trading family and a pathologist, David Gibson. Cynthia encouraged me to write and brought Christopher and Jeremy into the world. I left her, some say foolishly, when we were living in California in about 1981.

I was working for Cetus, making oligonucleotides. They were heady times. Biotechnology was in flower and one spring night while the California buckeyes were also in flower I came across the polymerase chain reaction. I was driving with Jennifer Barnett to a cabin I had been building in northern California. She and I had worked and lived together for two years. She was an inspiration to me during that time as only a woman with brains, in the bloom of her womanhood, can be. That morning she had no idea what had just happened. I had an inkling. It was the first day of the rest of my life.

From there it's a single sentence. I worked as a consultant, got the Nobel Prize, and have now turned to writing. It is 1994.

Role of Farm Women in Agriculture

Agriculture is the backbone of Indian Economy. Farm women play a vital role in encouraging the agricultural growth and production. Women are regarded as “the creators of all the green things in the world”. M.S. Swaminathan states that “it was women who first domesticated plants and they’re by initiated art of farming”. It is believed, that men produce the world food, and women prepare it for the table purpose. Rural women account for more than half of the food produced in the world. Farm women since centuries are involved in agriculture. According to census 2011, the total number of female workers in India is 149.8 million comprising of 121.8 million in rural areas and 28.00 million in urban areas respectively. Out of 149.8 million female workers 35.90 million female workers are working as cultivators and 61.50 million are agricultural labours while 52.40 million are engaged in agriculture and allied activities.

Categories of Farm Women in Agriculture

1. The landless agricultural labours.
2. Women cultivating their own piece of land and also working as wage labourers.
3. Women working in their own lands due to shortage of labours.
4. Women supervising the agricultural operation performed by labours on their own land.

Multi- Dimensional Role and Tasks of Farm Women

- Agriculture:** Sowing, transplanting, weeding, irrigation, fertilizer application, plant protection, harvesting, winnowing, storing, grading etc.
- Domestic:** Cooking, water collection, fuel wood collection, household maintenance.
- Allied Activities:** Cattle management, fodder collection, fuel wood gathering.

Participation of Farm Women in Agriculture and Allied Activities

Nearly 78% of all active women are engaged in agriculture as compared to 63% of men. About 70% of farm work is performed by women. Traditionally, women always play an important role in agriculture- as farmers, co-farmers, wage labourers and managers of farms:

- A. Women in India are major producers of food in terms of value, volume and number of hours worked. In rural India, the percentage of women who depend on agriculture is as high as 70%.
- B. In 2009 women survey, 94% of the female labour worked in cereal production, while 2.28% worked in vegetable production and 3.72% were engaged in fruits and spice crops.
- C. According to Food and Agriculture Organization, Indian women represented a share of 21% and 24% of all fishers and fish farmers respectively.

Challenges Faced by Farm Women

- ◆ Women have unequal land rights. Limited rights or access to arable land further limits livelihood options and exacerbates financial strain on women, especially in women- headed households.
- ◆ Women have limited access to use of productive resources.
- ◆ Women perform all un-mechanized agricultural tasks and perform multiple tasks.
- ◆ Women have little control over decision making process, either inside home or outside home.
- ◆ Without access to capital or household decision making abilities women lack the resources that are for their labour stability and stability of their household.
- ◆ Few women holding of agricultural productive resources such as land, animals and machinery.
- ◆ Women farmers in agricultural sector suffer from high illiteracy rate.

Farm women play the significant and crucial role in agricultural development and allied fields. The nature and extent of women's involvement in agriculture varies from region to region. But regardless of this variation there is high contribution of women towards agriculture.

Role of Mycorrhiza in Agriculture

Mycorrhiza are one of the most common and ancient symbioses on the planet. Most plants benefit from these plant–fungus relationships in terms of nutrition and water interactions. Mycorrhizae are important components of soil fertility, play a role in soil structuring and stabilization, and store carbon below ground. It is a unique perspective of mycorrhizal research advances at the interface of biological, soil, and earth sciences as well as in crop field.

Mycorrhiza is derived from the Greek words “myco” and “rhiza,” which mean “fungus” and “root,” respectively. The fungus and the roots of field crops and forest trees form a symbiotic relationship. The fungus colonizes the root tissues of the host plant in a mycorrhizal relationship, either inner side of the cell (intracellular) as in arbuscular mycorrhizal fungi (AMF) or outside the cell (ectomycorrhizal fungi). In general, the association is mutualistic and, in these mechanisms, the plant receives solar energy through chlorophyll and transfers it to the fungus, while the fungus provides the plant with water and vital mineral nutrition elements. Some families, such as *Brassicaceae* and *Chenopodiaceae*, do not have this type of association. The arbuscular form is the most widespread and found in 70 percent of plant species, including important field crops like wheat and rice. The *Amanitaceae*, *Bolataceae*, *Cortinariaceae*, *Russulaceae*, *Rhizopogonaceae*, *Sclerodermataceae*, and *Sclerodermataceae* families of ectotrophic fungi are mostly connected with tree taxa such as *pinus*, *populus*, *alnus*, *fagus*, *carpa*, and *salix*. The endotrophic fungi or arbuscular Mycorrhizae is mainly associated with most of the agronomic and horticultural trees. Mycorrhizae (plural) are divided into two types: ectomycorrhiza and endomycorrhiza. This classification is primarily based on the penetration of hyphae. The hyphae of ectomycorrhizal fungi do not penetrate into the root cell, but the hyphae of endomycorrhizal fungi penetrate into the cell.

Mechanisms

Mycorrhiza improves nutrient absorption in both physical and chemical ways. Physically, they provide a larger surface area for absorption. Chemically, they may secrete an organic acid that dissolves the nutrients; chelate a large number of ions, or ion exchange to liberate them from minerals.

Ectomycorrhizae fungi mechanism: A fungal sheath, or mantle, surrounds the roots of the host plant in this association, which is similar to the structure of ectomycorrhizal associations. The hyphae of the fungal hyphae also create a hartig net in the outer cortical cells. The hyphae form coils within the cells, allowing nutrients like phosphorus to be transferred from the fungus to the plant and vice versa. The mechanisms by which endomycorrhizae convert insoluble phosphorus into a usable form can be summarised as follows: insoluble Phosphorus in soil → fungi hyphae → fungal sheath → hartig net → cortex cell of roots → P to vascular bundle in plant

Endomycorrhizae fungi mechanism: Endomycorrhizal fungi's hyphae not only develop inside the plant's root, but also enter the cell walls and become encased in the cell membrane. The presence of

arbuscules and vesicles distinguishes the endomycorrhizae fungi. Vesicles serve as a reserve organ, releasing mineral elements to the plant or exchanging nutrients.

Benefits of Arbuscular Mycorrhizae (AM)

- ♦ Increased root absorption capacity as a result of morphological and physiological changes in the plant, as well as increased nutrient mobilisation from the soil to the plant (P, N, S, Cu, Zn, etc.).
- ♦ Better proliferation of P solubilizing bacteria in the rhizosphere enhanced nodulation and atmospheric nitrogen fixing ability in legumes.
- ♦ Antibiotic secretion suppresses disease and reduces root sensitivity to soil-borne pathogens. Mycorrhizas produce enzymes that are harmful to soil-dwelling creatures like worms.
- ♦ Increased production of PGR such as cytokinins and gibberellins.
- ♦ Plant adaptation to adverse environmental conditions such as drought and heavy metals; mycorrhizal fungus detoxify the environment for plant growth when heavy metal concentrations in soil are high.
- ♦ Glomalin, a glyco sugar protein, increases soil particle aggregation, which enhances soil structure and function by boosting aeration and water interactions. Glomalin is resistant to rapid decomposition, allowing for increased organic matter content in soil, which could be one of the most important carbon storages in the system.
- ♦ Increase's water retention and percolation; improves plant nutritional status while lowering fertiliser costs.
- ♦ Mycorrhizal fungi colonise plant roots and help them absorb mineral nutrients from the soil.
- ♦ Arbuscular mycorrhizal fungi alleviate the salt stress condition in the soil.

Mycorrhizae Role in Forestry

- ♦ Mycorrhiza plays an essential role in the establishment of forest in inhospitable environments such as barren land, wastelands, and so on.
- ♦ Trees with facultative endotrophic mycorrhiza operate as first invader in plant succession in wastelands.
- ♦ Using mycorrhizal fungi on forest trees promotes the creation of a mycorrhizal connection, which prevents the fungal root pathogens. This approach is particularly successful against *Phytophthora cinnamon* infection in the root of *Pinus clausa*.
- ♦ Mycorrhizae give nitrogenous substances to plants, which aid plant growth, particularly in acidic soils.

The agriculture sector is one of the most important application areas for mycorrhiza, particularly for wheat, oat, barley, maize and for most of other agricultural crops. Mycorrhiza is suitable for a variety of seed coating methods, including traditional seed coating and film coating. It is applied to agricultural seeds and provides considerable benefits to crops, such as increased yield, improved environmental stability, and a reduction in the use of chemical fertilizers.

BEEKEEPING: A NEED OF PRESENT CENTURY

The practice of beekeeping is as old as human civilization. In the past, honeybees were reared in log hive, pot hive and skep etc. for extracting honey only. But discovery of movable frame beehive, honey extractor, smoker during 19th century and the development of knowledge on biology, behaviour and management of honeybees give a scientific basis to the beekeeping. The term beekeeping was popularly used for rearing of two domesticated honey bee species only but with the development of beekeeping science and pollination need of the crops, the horizon has been widened. In Gujarat, *Apis dorsata*, *A. mellifera*, *A. cerana*, *A. florea* and *Tetragonula iridipennis* are the main honeybee species observed.

Bee belongs to the order Hymenoptera under sub order Apocrita. The Apocrita include the wasps, ants and bees. Probably the most important activity of bees, in terms of benefits to humans, is their pollination of natural vegetation, something that is rarely observed by non specialists and is almost never appreciated. Of course, the product of honeybee *i.e.*, wax and honey plus small quantity of royal jelly are of obvious benefit, but are of trivial value compared to the profoundly important role of bee as pollinators.

Pollination is an essential ecosystem service rendered by different pollinators. Pollinators and pollination are crucial in the functioning of almost all terrestrial ecosystem including man made “agriculture” and natural forest ecosystem. Pollinators transfer pollen from one flower to another, fertilizing the plant and increased productivity, consequently produce more food. Almost 70 per cent of the tropical crop species depend on pollinators for optimum yields. Closer to our immediate needs, many field plants or horticultural crops are bee pollinated plants. Pollinators are big deal than our climate change. Can you imagine the farming without bees in which farmers have to do pollination manually, how laborious task for man is it? What will be the monetary value? For that reason it has been said “If the bee disappeared off the face of the Earth, man would only have four years left to live.” Cross-pollination helps at least ٢٠ percent of the world’s crops and ١٠ percent of our wild plants to thrive. Estimated value of 2 to 3 \$ billion in annual crop pollination can be attributed to the activities of native bees and other insects. Percent increase in yield due to bee pollination in mustard, sunflower, cotton, lucerne, onion and apple were 43, 32-48, 17-19, 112, 93, and 44, respectively. When we look at the scope of beekeeping for pollination in India, total area of bee dependant crops in India is around 50 million hectare which required 150 million colonies to meet this, at the rate of 3 colonies per hectare. But at present there are only 1.2 million colonies exist. Hence there is a wide scope for expansion of bee keeping and fulfil the pollination need.

Bee keeping in India was mainly meant for production of honey. However with the progress

in research and development in apiculture, the other valuable beehive products such as beewax, royal jelly, bee venom, pollen and propolis have been known by the apiculturist. Commercialization of these products is a new boon to beekeeping industry. Honey is sweet viscous material produced by bees from the nectar of flowers, largely a mixture of dextrose and levulose dissolved in water and contains small amount of sucrose, mineral matter, vitamins, proteins and enzymes. Honey is utilized in products such as, medicine, food like – marmalade and jams, in ice-creams, whole dried fruits and nuts preserved in honey. Honey has been in use as medicine from time immemorial. Its super saturated nature does not allow growth of bacteria and other microbes. It is thus anti-microbial, antiseptic and nutritive properties help in healing of wounds and burns in natural ways. With the recent perceptible shift towards herbal preparation honey is increasingly used for manufacture of skin care and hair care products as a natural therapeutic and medicinal ingredient. Bee wax is mainly esters of fatty acids and various long chain alcohols. Composition of bee venom is complex and is composed of many active substances such as histamine, apamine, acithinase, hydrochloride acid, formic acid, orthophosphoric acid, sulphur, calcium, copper and magnesium sulphate. Rheumatism cannot be cured by any other system of medicine but majority of patients can be cured by bee venom. Royal jelly is composed of proteins 15-18%, lipid 2-6%, carbohydrates 9-18% and ash 0.7-1.2%. It contains 65-70% moisture. Royal jelly is very nutritive food for human beings as it increases vigour and vitality. Propolis is mainly composed of resins and balsams 55%, ethanol and scented oils 10% and pollen 5%. It has quality of healing wounds effectively and common use in preparing ointment for treating cuts, wounds and abscesses in cattle.

Honey bees in their brood and adult stage are infected by various types of diseases. It is affected by large numbers of viral, bacterial, fungal and protozoan organisms. The extent of losses varies from death of some brood or adults to complete annihilation of colonies. The bee viruses appear to be species specific. Three viruses, *viz*, *Apis iridescent virus*, Thai sac brood virus and Kashmir bee virus have been reported in India. Bacterial *i.e.* American foul brood (AFB) and European foul brood disease as well as fungal diseases, *viz.* Chalk brood (*Ascophera apis*) and stone brood (*Aspergillus flavus*) are known in honeybee. Spore forming protozoan is also infecting adult bees. Honeybees are subjected to predation and infestation by various enemies such as wasps, wax moth, wax beetles, ants, birds, lizard, cockroach and mite etc.

Application of huge amount of pesticides at regular interval and indiscriminate use of pesticides by farmers cause adverse effect in agro ecosystem. Honey bees are susceptible to many groups of pesticides which are used in pest control programme. Pesticidal poisoning is recently overshadowing all other problems in apiculture. Farmers in India mostly use small holders and use manual sprayers / dusters for treating small crop area. This results into a continuous exposure of honey bee to pesticidal poisoning. Moreover, visible integrated approach is lacking by farmers of India for management of pest and diseases. Selective use of insecticide is one of the prerequisite for integrated pest management. Neonicotinoids, a class of systemic insecticides are more frequently associated with the pollinators declines. The study found that 75 percent

of honey samples collected from nearly 200 sites across the globe contained at least one of five kinds of pesticides called neonicotinoids. Losses of bees due to field application of pesticides serve as valuable information but such studies and assessment are difficult to be made.

Benefits which man accrues from insecticides, these chemicals provide the best opportunity to those who juggle with the risk-benefit equations and to provide protection from insect pests damage. Insecticides are often the only practical way to control the insects. Apart from its benefits other side is more violent *i.e.* insecticides have contaminated almost every part of our environment and pose a great threat to biodiversity, residue in food and soil, resistance problem, risk to mammals and birds, adverse effect on soil and human health and one of the most devastating threats is to honeybees and other pollinators which ultimately reduced crop productivity. Thus, the chemical war is never won and all life is caught in its violent crossfire.

It has been found that bees can pass proteins from nectar unchanged into honey. If GM crops produce novel proteins or toxins in the nectar as well, this may further threaten the safety of honey produce from GM crops.

Apiculture is useful not only to the beekeepers who receive income from honey and beeswax but it also benefits the community as a whole. The trait of honeybees to visit and pollinate blossom has been explored for pollinating orchard, vegetables, oilseed and other crops for increasing yield. Like water, fertilizer and pesticides, honey bees are considered as input for crop production and also include as part in Integrated Farming Systems or bio-farming. To create awareness not only among the beekeepers and farmers but each and every individual person to boost up the apiculture.

At A Glance



The dreams of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel and Kanaiyalal Munshi paved the road map of the then Institute of Agriculture, Anand (1936-1939). Sheth Shri Amrutlal Hargovinddas (Ahmedabad) donated Rs. 5.0 lakh in 1946 in the memory of his late son Shri Bansilal to start Agriculture college as a component of the Institute of Agriculture. The college was named as “Bansilal Amrultal college of Agriculture”. The foundation stone was laid by Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel on 6th April, 1947. The college building was inaugurated by Kanaiyalal Munshi. The first batch was admitted during 1947-48. The three statues of viz., Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, Shri Kanyailal Munshi and Dr. M. D. Patel were erected in front of University Bhavan, AAU, Anand to keep their memories live at this campus.

The college was affiliated with Bombay University (1948-50), then with Gujarat University (1951-60) and Sardar Patel University (1957-71). In 1972, Gujarat Agricultural University was established and this college became a part of GAU till 2004. On 1st May, 2004, Anand Agricultural University was established and B A College of Agriculture is now a constituent college of Anand Agricultural University. The college has celebrated its Golden jubilee during 1996-97. Till the date about 6500 students got their degree of B.Sc.(Agri.), 2350 M.Sc.(Agri.) and 650 Ph.D. from this college.

The past students association of B A college of agriculture was established in 1986. This association was registered as Bansilal Amrultal College of Agriculture Alumni Association, Anand (Regd. No.Guj/729/Anand/15-2-2003 in the year 2003).

Membership

Agricultural Research Service (ARS)

ARS Exams conducted by ASRB are National level exams for the recruitment of Assistant Research Scientist at various National level Research station and deemed University like IARI, NDRI, IVRI and CIFE. The minimum requirement for this exam has now become Ph.D. in any research field followed by exam pattern as follows:

Pattern of ARS Examination :

Two separate competitive written examinations followed by Viva-voce shall be conducted as per the following plan of examinations:-

Preliminary ARS Examination Paper:-

Preliminary ARS Examination shall have one paper of 150 marks with all multiple type objective questions to be solved in 02 hours (Two hours), from the respective professional subject(s) for which candidate has opted. 1/3 marks will be deducted for each wrong answer in Preliminary ARS Examination (Objective Type). This is a qualifying examination and marks scored will not be counted for final selection.

The candidates who attain such minimum qualifying marks in the Preliminary Examination as may be fixed by the Board in its discretion will be allowed to appear in the Main Examination.

(b). ARS – Main Examination Paper:- ARS – Main Examination Paper will have only one paper of 240 marks to be completed in 3 hours duration. The paper shall be divided in three parts A, B and C. Part ‘A’ will consist of 40 (forty) questions of 2 (two) marks each. In this part, answers required will be of very short, not exceeding 10 (Ten) words at the most. Part ‘B’ will have 20 (twenty) questions of 5 (five) marks each requiring one or two paragraphs and/or graphic explanation. Part ‘C’ will have 6 (six) essay type or descriptive type questions. Each question will carry 10 (ten) marks and may have two or more parts. Answers are required to be written in the space provided below the question. In no case extra sheets will be provided. All questions in parts ‘A’ ‘B’ and ‘C’ will be compulsory.

The candidates who obtain such minimum qualifying marks in the Main Examination as may be fixed by the Board in its discretion, shall be called for viva-voce in the ratio of 1:5 (category-wise) for each post. Reserved candidates who qualify after availing relaxed standard and/or age relaxation shall render themselves ineligible for UR posts. They will be eligible only for the posts which are reserved in respective category in a particular discipline. The final selection of candidates will be made on the basis of marks obtained in the ARS – Mains Examination and Viva- voce. The finally selected candidates will be recommended for appointment as Scientists in the Indian Council of Agricultural Research.
