Constitution Day is celebrated on 26th November every year to commemorate the adoption of the Constitution of India. On 26th November 1949, the Constituent Assembly of India adopted the Constitution of India, which came into effect on 26th January 1950. The current year 2024 marks the 75th year of the adoption of the Constitution of India. Dr. Shrikant B. Katole, Programme Officer, NSS told that the Indian Constitution, which is created after the huge self-churning, is the largest constitution in the world. After studying the constitutional systems of many democratic countries of the world, the Indian Constitution had come into existence. He further showed with PowerPoint presentation that the Indian Constitution provides the framework for fundamental political values, outlines government institution’s responsibilities, powers and procedures. It also establishes fundamental rights, directive principles and citizen’s responsibilities and rights. The India constitution is the longest written constitution in the world. Originally it contained 395 articles, 22 parts and 8 schedules in it. Overtime, additional articles and parts were inserted through various amendments, and currently our Constitution contains 470 articles, 25 parts, 12 schedules and 5 appendices. Dr. B.R. Ambedkar remarked, Constitutional morality is not a natural sentiment. It has to be cultivated. In this context, the day was commemorated to honour and respect the contributions of the framers of the constitution, as well as to educate the students and public about the essential ideals enshrined in the constitution.

The oath was administered by student representatives. As a mark of respect, a fitting tribute was paid to Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, who played a pivotal role in drafting the Constitution by 5th year student Mr. Chudasama Parthrajsinh Pushpendrasinh through his speech.
